

Essay Competition – Grades 9-12

Competition Description:

The Essay Competition allows MISSION: STEM coordinators to reinforce STEM skills through writing. Students will choose between a non-fiction or science-fiction topic to write an original essay. Students will write an original 750-1000 word <u>essay</u> and provide a <u>Works Cited page</u>.

Non-Fiction Topics:

- 1. Advanced AI technology is everywhere and it requires a lot of resources, such as electricity and water. Write about the advantages and disadvantages of using this technology. How can people use this technology responsibly and protect the environment? Use at least 2 reliable sources.
- 2. Research the history of the International Space Station. What is the purpose of it? How has it evolved over the years to what it is today? What do experts say about the future of space stations? Use at least 2 reliable sources.

Science-Fiction Topics:

- 1. You are the captain of a voyage to Mars that will set up a new colony. You must select a team of people to travel with you. Who would you choose and why? How long will the journey take? What will life look like once you arrive on Mars? What other considerations must you make? What could go wrong? Use scientific reasoning (e.g. gravity, atmosphere, food production, etc.) to support your choices and predictions.
- 2. New technologies are constantly emerging with the promise of improving our everyday lives. Choose a technology that you think is overrated or harmful. Explain why and propose realistic improvements or alternatives. Include technical and social impacts.

Suggested Process Map:

- 1. Choose a topic from either the non-fiction or science-fiction list.
- 2. Research the topic.
- 3. Draft the essay, read, and review.
- 4. Ask your MISSION: STEM coordinator, ELA teacher, and/or parent/guardian for feedback.
- 5. Revise based on the feedback, and if necessary, repeat, by going back to step 3 with changes.
- 6. Finalize your essay.
- 7. Create a Works Cited page and list of all the sources you used (and cited) in your essay.
- 8. Submit your cover page, finalized essay, and Works Cited page. All components should be combined into one PDF file.
